3. Sweeper Bid

Manager Sheila Aldrich Memo: Please find attached the sweeper bid that Nick has been working on with our State buyer. We are members of the State contract, so the equipment is purchased at the lowest price possible, as the State does the bidding on many pieces. Nick will be talking with us and giving us information and answering questions on the sweeper.

Nick and Corey are hoping for both the General Fund and Sewer Fund to share in the cost for the sweeper as it benefits both departments.

Nick: The Sweeper is from Bell equipment. Five were ordered and there is still one available and this sweeper has every option that we wanted. We have the option of using our current sweeper as a trade in or putting it out for bids. The maximum we could trade in for would be \$5,000.00. I recommend we take the \$5,000.00.

The company also sent a lease to own payment plan: for 5 years we would make ten payments. There is a 7-year option as well, but we typically do not go anything over 5 years. Corey and I would split the payments so we would each make 5 payments over the next five years.

Corey-I think everything looks good and by going through the State buying program it will save the City a lot of money.

- Aldrich-talked about the dredging right of entry, Bruce has looked it over and it will be signed by the Mayor and sent on
- Barr-Construction CSO Phase 1 is going great, the Municipal water tower is back in service it was out for about 4 ½ weeks, On July 10th we had a significant rain CSO/SSO rain event that was reported to the State.
