2. Updates and Discussion on Current and Future Projects.

Manager Aldrich Memo. Our Mayor will update lead us in discussion on current projects, future projects, and possible projects. This will be a good opportunity for all of us to have time to ask questions about current projects, get updated on any of them that we have questions on and to also discuss future projects along with projects that we would like to see happen.

We found that this was basically a meeting with no action items and thought this would be an excellent opportunity for these updates and discussions.

- Marina Project- Will be starting in the Spring
- Cherry Street Project – Will be bundled in with the regular CSO Project next spring due to bids coming in high.
- Mayor Perilloux and Amy will be flying out to Princeton, New Jersey to attend the Robert Wood Johnson event October 9th-11th.
- Paul Bunyan Park – The first meeting has not been held yet with the engineering firm.
- November General Election – The proposals on the ballot will include The proposal to Levy a millage to construct, operate, furnish and equip a new county jail and to continue the sheriff's road patrol for the county of Schoolcraft, and also the proposal to initiate a law to use and cultivation of marijuana products by individuals who are at least 21 years of age and older and commercial sales of marijuana through state licensed retailers. Tax Revenue distribution from the marijuana would be 15% dispensaries or stores in the community, 15% to the County, 35% to school aid fund, 35% to state for road and bridge repair.

3. Citizen Comments.

Citizen- Question regarding the marijuana proposal, does the City have responsibility for the effect on the County?

Citizen- Commend the young man who built the safety stations down by the boardwalk.

Manager Aldrich:

- Flannel Fest will be held October 6th.

Corey Barr:

- This year the Troop 400 will have 5 Eagle Scouts. A couple projects they are doing besides the safety stations are working on the trail out on State Rd, on 17 acres putting more benches on the trail and cleaning it up. They also did a project with the Manistique Public Schools, they made storage and shelving for the drama club.
